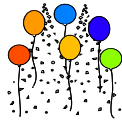

OASD GLOBAL SERVICE LEARNING PROGRAM

The Oconomowoc Area School District has announced a new Service Learning Program for 7-12th grade students. The district has made a commitment to expose students to different cultures and customs. It's critical in a global environment to build a sense of understanding, respect and appreciation of people and cultures beyond our own.

Our Kiwanis club has been invited by the Nature Hill Intermediate School to participate in their Service Learning Program. Students 7-8th grades will be eligible to go to the Dominican Republic to experience the values of service, commitment and compassion. In support of this learning program we have offered a \$500 Kiwanis Breakfast Club Scholarship for their use as students become committed.

While the travel portion of this program for the Nature Hill 7 & 8th graders will be in the summer of 2017, Silver Lake intermediate school has 8 students going this summer of 2016.

The Nature Hill students will have a week activity this summer to learn about community service. They have between 15 & 20 signed up. Our Kiwanis club has offered to work with them on Wednesday morning, June 22nd. There is a project under consideration that will require all of us to work that day with the kids on that community development project.

Kiwanis support of the OASD Global Learning and Leadership Program offers opportunities for students to learn service and leadership. As plans are developed we are asking all Kiwanis members to put the date of June 22nd down as a Kiwanis work day. We will keep you posted as plans are finalized.
