It's time to ReMember!

Retention is an ongoing issue for Kiwanis clubs. Members are frequently lost if they are not fully engaged in club activities and no one has made an attempt to re-involve them. Before dropping a member who has not attended club meetings or participated in service projects, the club should make an effort to “**ReMember**” that person.

Reconnect that member to the club's fellowship and service.

This August and September, a simple plan to ReMember can boost membership and enthusiasm.

- Review the roster to identify members who have become inactive.
- Assign club members to contact “missing” members.
- Contact members by phone or personal visit.
- Invite members to attend a special meeting or project.
- Conduct a fun meeting to celebrate the club's accomplishments.

Get back to basics.

Many members leave for reasons that could have been prevented – if the club had

offered a membership experience filled with fun, fellowship and meaningful service.

Take time to review your club's habits and how they affect the value members get in return for their involvement. Be sure your club offers orientation and continuing Kiwanis education for members. Keep members informed about club events. Avoid member burnout with proper planning and staffing of events. Celebrate club and individual accomplishments. Finally, recognize members for their efforts and contributions.

Additional tips:

- Create a “buddy system” to pair active and inactive members.
- Plan a special “Homecoming” meeting to celebrate club history.
- Schedule a service project with Service Leadership program members.
- Send “We Miss You” postcards to every member who misses two meetings in a row.
- Recognize accomplishments at every club meeting and event.
- Say “thank you” often and in a variety of ways

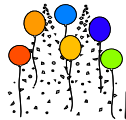

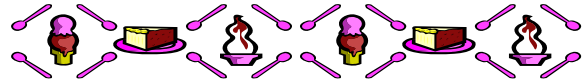

Meet New Member - James Fulmer

Jim was born in Oconomowoc on September 10, 1948. He graduated from Oconomowoc High School in 1967 and spent 1 ½ years at UW-Whitewater.

From 1969 to 1971 Jim served in the U.S. Army with a tour in Vietnam. Twice a year Jim, along with other Vietnam Veterans attend High School History classes to talk with the students about their Vietnam experience.

He received certification in law enforcement with the CIA and FBI in Georgia. Jim retired from law enforcement after 33 years. Jim has been connected with the YMCA and was on the board for inclusion for special needs and has coached several special Olympic teams, swimming, bowling, basketball, bocce and now has started up a softball team this season.
