Good time to catch up on some of the to do lists as February looks cold too.

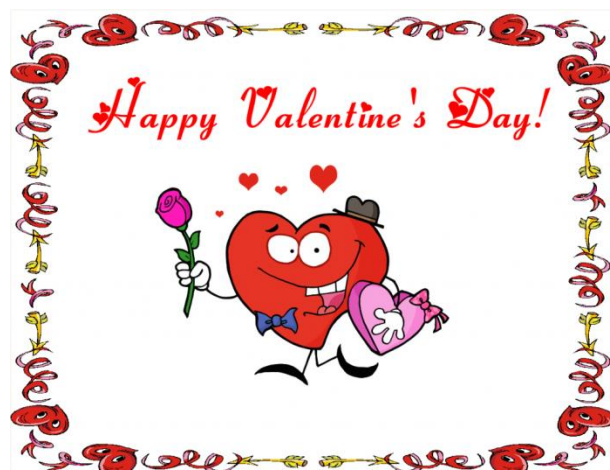
This is Kiwanis slow time of the year so try to bring a prospective member to a meeting.

Radio Day ,which was skipped last year in October due to scheduling conflicts is back on at WTKM for Sunday, March 25th.

In the past we usually had other things going on that took away from our contacting the businesses.
