KIWANIS KIDS

Under the leadership of President Liz Bednar, our breakfast club is now affiliated with a group of children at Cushing Elementary School, a national blue ribbon school of excellence, in Delafield. A new **Kiwanis Kids** Club has been established.

Kiwanis Kids, with more than 33,000 members, is a service leadership program for primary school students. K-Kids provides students with opportunities to work together on service projects, to develop leadership potential and to create moral character.

K-Kids is a “student-led” community organization, which operates under school regulations and draws its members from the student body. K-Kids clubs can also be established in a community-based organization. Such organizations might include, but are not limited to the following: community library, Boys’ Club, Girls’ Club, YMCA, YWCA, or a church. K-Kids is unique because it’s sponsored by a local Kiwanis club, composed of leading business and professional people of the community.

Service and Fundraising

This year, K-Kids raised more than \$30,000 for UNICEF through organizing various fundraisers. Other K-Kids service projects include such activities as organizing clothing, book, food and recycling drives; planning teacher appreciation events; creating greeting cards for nursing home residents, making sew-free blankets for children’s hospital patients and making picture books for kindergarten students.


